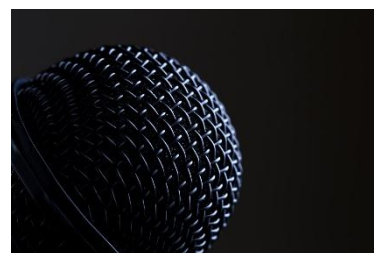
**Notes:** Arrive by 8:45 am sharp. We'll return by 2 pm.

**In-service: Playdough and Karaoke**

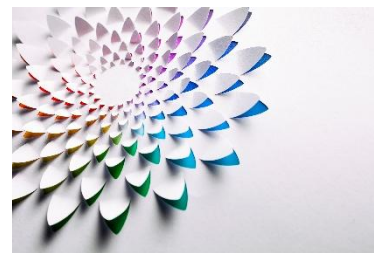

### **Program notes:**

- Children are required to bring warm clothes (layered for flexibility), closed-toed shoes (not thongs or sandals), and a water bottle. Children should bring wet weather gear on excursion days if the forecast suggests a possibility of rain.
- No breakfast, morning tea, or lunch is provided. Morning tea and lunch need to be brought from home. Products containing nuts and seafood are not permitted due to the attendance of children with anaphylaxis. An Afternoon Tea snack will be provided by the service.
- Policies and procedures for transporting children and risk management plans for excursions and other activities where necessary are in place and available at the service or by request. Families will be informed as soon as possible if an amendment is made to the schedule of planned activities.
- Please ensure you arrive at the program at least 45 minutes before excursion departure times or earlier if requested by the service. Ensure you sign the permission form which will be available upon arrival.
- There is a low possibility that excursions and other activities will be cancelled due to extreme weather. Alternative indoor activities will be provided for such days.
- Provisions contained within the Medical Conditions Policy and Administration of Medication Procedure are strictly adhered to and compliance with them is a condition of attendance. Ensure all medical and dietary requirements are detailed on the Enrolment Form and that action plans are uploaded.
- Children are not permitted to bring devices which can store data (including phones, smartwatches and fitness devices). Any that are brought will be collected, stored and returned at pick-up.
